


- Question 3: If still a student, in what year do you expect to achieve your degree goal?

Bottom line: Based on the survey in the next 3 years we have 46 new PhD's in the pipeline -


more than in 2005, but less than in 1995


 Question 4: If still a student, what is your ultimate goal?




Large part of Community on Soft Money


#### Number of Proposals Necessary for Research

434 people answered the question; 76 people skipped the question

Too frequent: 6.5% (28 respondents)

Just right: 73.0% (317 respondents)

Too infrequent: 20.5% (89 respondents)

# 25. Should the DPS select a small number of inexpensive locations and alternate meetings between them?

422 people answered the question; 88 people skipped the question

YES: 51.9% (219 respondents)

NO: 48.1% (203 respondents)
